Dear Parent/Carer

Thank you for all your kindness and support throughout this term, a term that has been a lot longer than usual. We have much to celebrate.

Every week I am blown away by what we celebrate in our Friday assemblies. So many children have collected certificates and prizes recognising their hard work and commitment to our virtues. Their kindness, friendship, and enthusiasm to learning is commendable and a credit to you as their parents and carers. We are also able to celebrate sporting and music achievements as they arise, as well as our Parc Eglos Health & Wellbeing Awards and each classes Reader of the Week.



Through this term we have given recognition to Safer Internet Day and raised awareness to stand up to bullying, as well as a big awareness to road safety. It was great to work with PCSO Julia Berry on this. A week of events celebrated our love of reading, and all things book related, this then enabled us to invest in more lovely books for our children to enjoy. We began the term thinking about refugees, children in Y2 - Y6 took part in the 'I packed it Myself' Project, the reality of which helped with our thinking and understanding around those leaving their homes in Ukraine later in the term. Your kindness and generosity enabled us as a school to support refugees fleeing to Poland where they could find greater safety.

Covid Update

In line with guidance released this month we have amended our risk assessments changing the protocol in our school next term. *From 1 April, anyone with a positive COVID-19 test result will be advised to try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for five days, which is when they are most infectious. For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice will be three days.* If your child tests positive for coronavirus they must stay at home for three days now, or longer if dependent on their symptoms. We do not expect children to return if they are too unwell to be in school.

We will continue to put control measures in place that will help us to manage the spread of infection. These reinforce good hygiene practices such as hand washing and ensuring our spaces around school are well ventilated.
